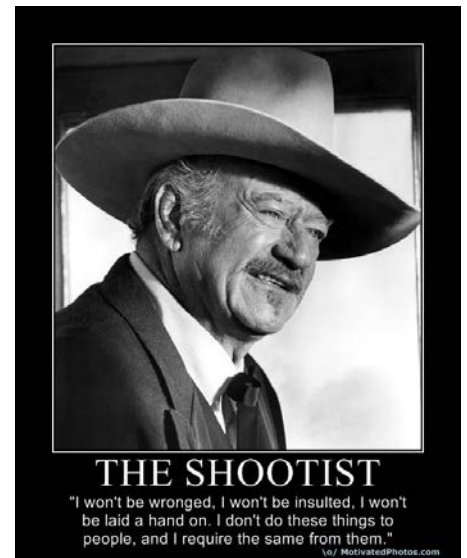

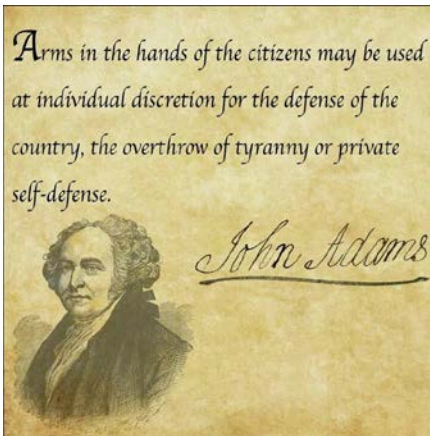

COWBOY OBITUARY

Bill West
SASS Alias: Sycamore Willie
August, 1933 – March, 2017

SASS shooters will remember Sycamore Willie for his big long handle bar mustache and his genuine old time western appearance. He always "looked the part" of the Cowboy Action time frame in history. Bob Sanders, when asked about Bill West's shooting skills, said, "Bill always had a clean shoot", meaning that Sycamore Willie almost never missed a target. He was very accurate and always a joy to be around during competition.

Growing up in Dallas, Bill served in the Army for 16 months in Korea after graduating Sunset High School. He then served on the Grand Prairie Police force both as a patrolman and as the force's crime photographer. Through the years, Bill West owned a camera store, sold sports cars with Carroll Shelby, and taught scuba diving and underwater photography. He worked full time as Security at Mountain View College and eventually owned and operated an Arabian Horse Stables.

In 1981, Bill West Joined the Dallas County Sheriff's Department and became a deputy sheriff. In 2001, Bill and his wife Angie joined SASS and began their happy and fun sixteen years of Cowboy Action Shooting. They shot mostly at Ft Parker but also at Lone Star & Comanche Valley Vigilantes as well as other local clubs. It was one of Bill's favorite past times and hobbies. Sycamore Willie often helped movie star Buck Taylor with Buck's art gallery shows, looking the parts as he and Angie came dressed in their western attire and side arms. Angie attained some fame when she submitted a story line to TV's "Gunsmoke" series, which was used & aired on the legendary TV show.

Sycamore Willie will be missed-that's for sure.



FORT CHADBOURNE A HIDDEN GEM

TWO MORE GUN FIGHTS WITH DOC HOLLIDAY

We last read that Tobe Driskell and 25 of his cowboys may have been trying to get the best of Wyatt Earp. Driskell was the wealthy Texas business family that started the Driskell Hotel in Austin, TX that still has that name today. Doc Holliday stepped in and most likely saved Wyatt's life. As the cattle drive season slowed down in the fall of 1878, Doc left the dusty town of Dodge City, KS. He was hoping the climate of Colorado might be more comfortable for his lungs.

Doc and Kate took the train to Trinidad, CO, a town on the 800 mile Santa Fe Trail. Trains from Denver in 1876 and from Dodge in 1878 made the town a real trading center. Doc knew that gambling in Trinidad ought to be pretty good. His consumption just got worse; he was advised to go on to the hot springs in Las Vegas, New Mexico Territory, to see if the hot sulfur baths could give him relief. Another important reason Holliday left Trinidad was a gun fight with the infamous Kid Colton. The Kid insulted Doc and Katie, and an argument commenced. The Kid drew on Doc, who shot the Kid in self defense with a new Colt Peacemaker pistol Bat Masterson had given to him back in Dodge. The gun fight resulted in severe damage to the Kid's shootin' arm. Though he clearly acted in self defense, Doc skedaddled rather than chance another encounter with the courts and the law.

Doc and Katie traveled over primitive Raton Pass to New Mexico Territory, then on to find help for his tuberculosis ravaged lungs. Their destination was Montezuma Hot

Springs in Gallinas Canyon, near Las Vegas, New Mexico.

For a time, Doc's condition improved from the use of the Hot Sulfur Baths. However, he commenced gambling again; as in Dallas, this was against the law. In no time, he got arrested and thrown into the hoosegow. Facing more jail time and fines, Doc realized it was prudent to move on once again. From there, he and Katie traveled to the town of Otero, just north of Las Vegas; here, gamblin' was welcomed. Doc was able to resume his dental practice in Otero, joining up with dentist named Fagaly. They became partners.

Holliday did not stay here long either. He had a good thing going, but his friend Bat Masterson needed Doc to return to Dodge. Bat needed Doc's help. A nasty railroad dispute was brewing. Bat was the High Sheriff of Ford County, but was also an agent for the Santa Fe Railroad. In the summer of 1879, Doc left Katie back in Otero and returned to Dodge. Unfortunately, the horrible drought in and around Dodge was so bad the dust caused Doc's lungs to take a turn for the worse. The lack of grass for the cattle had all but dried up the cattle drives to the Dodge City area. Even Wyatt Earp said arrests were way down due to fewer cattle and cowboys causing trouble at the end of the trail. But Doc was there because Bat Masterson needed him and others to help guard and protect the railroad in conflicts regarding contracts for building the tracks through Royal Gorge. Doc was assigned the task of guarding the Santa Fe telegraph and roundhouse in Pueblo, CO. The Santa Fe Railroad and the Denver Rio Grande Railroad were literally fighting in court and on the ground over which one would get the contract to lay tracks through the Gorge.

A small war developed. About 50 members of a mob from the Denver

Rio Grande attacked the Santa Fe Telegraph and Roundhouse that Holliday and Josh Webb were guarding. Fifty against two was bad odds. As the mob attacked, Doc let 'em have it with both blasts from a double-barreled shot gun he was using. No one was injured by the gun blast, as they were quickly over powered. Josh got his teeth and face bashed in during the brief take over. They returned to Dodge having been defeated in this skirmish. The battle over control of the rails ended. The courts decided that both companies must share in the contract to build tracks through the 1000 feet deep Royal Gorge along the Arkansas River. Over all, the Railroad War had ended without much other gun play, and that was good.

Back in Dodge, Bat was just glad to be able to concentrate on being the sheriff. Doc was able to practice some dentistry, as the rainy season settled the dust. The never ending rain soon turned the streets of Dodge from a dust bowl into a mess of slop and mud. Doc Holliday decided to go back to New Mexico Territory and the company of Kate Fisher. There was always trouble on the horizon though.
