DOC HOLLIDAY MEETS WYATT EARP IN FT. GRIFFIN

Our last adventure with Doc Holliday left him gambling in Breackenridge, TX. He got into an altercation with Faro Dealer Henry Kahn. Trying to obey the law, Doc was unarmed. Holliday questioned his method of dealing and Henry Kahn attacked him. Doc tried to defend himself with a cane, but Kahn pulled an illegal

derringer pistol and shot Holliday. Doc almost died, and a relative from Georgia even came to get his body-- only to discover that Doc had lived. He took Holliday to Ft. Worth, where Doc rested, healed, and recovered somewhat.

His family wanted Doc to return to Georgia, but he was too ashamed and embarrassed to return. In 1877, he caught the stage back to Ft. Griffin, by then a real town with its own full time sheriff. The sheriff was John Larn. Larn was a cattle rustler, all around outlaw, and the sheriff all in one. Also in town during this time were several people already becoming famous who would eventually play big roles in the life story of Doc Holliday. Three of these were outlaw Johnny Ringo, gambler and brothel owner Lottie Deno, and singer-dancer Katie Elder. Katie had been Doc's lover a while back in St Louis, before he run out on her. Also in town were Pony Diehl and Curly Bill Brocius, major players in the events in Tombstone just a few years later. Dr. Holliday opened a dental office in Ft. Griffin; he also resumed his lucrative gambling pastime, which was the main source of his income. By some accounts, it was about this time of 1877-1878 that Wyatt Earp came to Ft. Griffin; he and Doc met, developed a mutual respect, and became friends of sorts. After a short while, Waytt moved on to Ft. Worth, then to Dodge City.

There are several versions of how and why Doc and Katie left Ft. Griffin. One is that Doc killed a man with a knife in a card game, was arrested, and would be hanged. Katie set fire to a building as a distraction, during which they escaped. Another version is that lawmen from Dallas found out Doc was in Ft. Griffin. In this, they pursued Doc with a warrant for his arrest. Doc was to return to stand trial and go to jail for the gambling charge he had run out on. The sheriff

in Ft. Griffin arrested Doc, and planned to take him back to Dallas. Realizing this would likely mean jail time for Holliday, Katie still set fire to a building to keep the town folks busy while she and Doc escaped Ft. Griffin. They went on horseback and via stagecoach to Ft. Elliott along the Dodge City Trail, now an almost fading town since the great buffalo kill was over in 1878. They stayed a few months in Sweetwater, the little town by the Fort, while Kattie recovered from a miscarriage. During those months, Doc worked as a dentist for the soldiers at the fort. In May of 1878. Doc and Katie arrived by stage to Dodge, having come through Camp Supply in Indian Territory.

Dodge City near old Ft. Dodge had become a cattle drive destination with a railroad. This was then the Cowboy Capitol of the West, and was also known as the most sinful town in the west. Doc found out that brothers Wyatt and Morgan Earp were members of the law there in Dodge, with Wyatt being the main lawman in town. They often could be found at the Long Branch Saloon. Wyatt ran a tight town when it came to the wild activities of the cow hands celebrating the end to a long trail drive from Texas. Likewise, the cowboys and trail bosses did not like having Waytt interfere with their celebrating. Many wanted Earp dead. The situation was fixin to get tough. Stay tuned for the next episode.
