WILD BUNCH CORNER

Between EOT and the hot weather, we had 3 Wild Bunch shooters show up for the June match. Our numbers may have been small, but we had a high old time. While the weather was warm, we had a good breeze & lots of shade under the pecan tree and Brazos Point.

First stage at the old school house was quick & easy to get everyone going. Twenty one pistol, 7 rifle or 5 Doughboy targets, with the 2 sets of static pistol targets engaged outside to inside & 7 rounds allowed to knock down the 5 snuff can plates, with any leftover on the hanging bells.

Stage #2 was also at the school. Twenty one pistol, 8 rifle or 5 Doughboy and 6 shotgun. Starting with shotgun at the ready, alternate on the 2 targets, 2 sweeps of the 4 static rifle targets, the 2 banks of static pistol targets engaged inside to outside & the snuff cans for 5 & last 2 rounds on the farthest rifle targets. Now it was time to get under the shade at Brazos Point.

Stage #3 was 28 pistol, 5 shotgun & 5 rifle. Pistol caliber rifle or bolt gun, all shots were on Doughboy targets at 50 to 60 yards. Start at the east end of BP with rifle at the ready,

engage the rifle targets. Then with 1911, and 14 rounds, engage the dueling tree, being allowed 7 rounds to clear the 6 plates & then alternate the remaining 7 or 8 rounds on 2 static targets. If you cleared the 6 plates on the dueling tree with 6 rounds, this was an excellent opportunity to try a tactical reload. Well, Hoodoo did just that, 6 rounds spent, dropped the empty mag, slapped in a fresh mag & proceeded to try to disengage the slide stop 3 or 4 times before realizing that the pistol was already in battery. No time saved there! Then a 7 round sweep of the pistol targets & on to the west end for another dueling tree & 5 shotgun targets.

Stage #4, also at BP was 35 pistol & 5 shotgun. Again starting at the east end, there were dueling trees, sweeps & Nevada sweeps on big targets and small flippers on the hostage targets, movement to the west end with another dueling tree & 5 shotgun targets.

Stage #5, & it was a dandy with 28 pistol, 9 rifle and 5 shotgun. Greased Lightnin' & Triple F decided that they would shoot the BAMB targets with their pistol caliber rifles at distances out to 100 yards. Hoodoo was shooting rifle caliber lever gun & did not have a pistol caliber rifle that would hold 9 rounds. But he did have a Win 94 & a Win 86, so with 5 rounds in the 94 & 4 rounds in the 86, he was ready to play. Two different rifles in 2 different calibers, what's difficult about that? At the east end with rifle at the ready, engage the 9 BAMB targets. Then with 1911, engage the dueling tree & the small flipper on the hostage target twice for 14 rounds. Then to the west end & another dueling tree & small flipper for 14 rounds & finish with the shotgun.

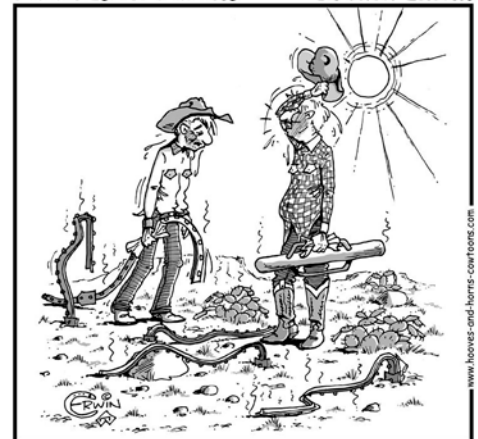
We decided not to have any clean matches so Shady would not have to

waste paper printing out clean match shooters. No thanks necessary. After a nice lunch by Chula Kat, scores from Shady and some good natured ribbing all around, it was BAMB time. Triple F had to leave but Greased Lightnin' & Hoodoo had 2 quick BAMB rounds.

First one was 10 rounds on 4 targets in a continuous Nevada sweep, kneeling & using a table for a rest. Both shooters were clean, with Hoodoo barely edging out GL. Second course was 5 rounds, standing, off hand, with no support. Targets were engaged 1-5-1-5-1, with #1 at 100 yards & #5 at 60 yards. GL was smooth, fast & clean. Hoodoo was less smooth, less fast & missed the last target. Good shooting GL.

If you ever have the desire to shoot some Wild Bunch, come on out and join us. With the regular classes of Traditional & Modern, an open class(with .22's and just about anything else), BAMB, Doughboy(with bolt guns) and Rebelde Gringos (lever guns in rifle caliber) you can probably find something you like. Just remember that no matter what guns you shoot, everything is lead bullets on this range. Until next time, Y'all take care!

YOU SHOOT TODAY IT KILLS TOMORROW

“You shoot today, it kills tomorrow.” That is what the frontiersmen said about the Big Fifty Sharps rifle used for hunting the buffalo. For the shooters who learned the ballistics of this firearm, and to control the weapon, they could consistently kill a bison at over 400 yards. But they had to really be masters of shot placement. The arc and drop of the bullet was significant. Buffalo hunters each killed 1000s, and thus were able to master the technique.

The events in history that resulted in the mass extinction of the bison really fell into place. Up till 1872-1873, a large number of buffalo were harvested. To that time, this was mainly to provide meat for the army troops on the frontier and the railroad crews that commenced to move west of the Mississippi. Hides were also sold to make buffalo robes. But up till that time, good techniques for tanning the tough thick hides had not been developed.

Then, in 1870, J. Wright Mocar came to Fort Hays. He joined in the meat hunting for the army soldiers. In 1871, W.C. Lobenstein was the main buyer of hides. In 1871, in the new City of Dodge, Lobenstein received an order for hides from a tannery in

England. He hired Charles Rath and Charles Myers to obtain the buffalo hides for the order. They hired J. Wright Mocar to do the shooting. Not just anyone had the skills for such shooting; Mocar was already getting a reputation for his shooting skills.

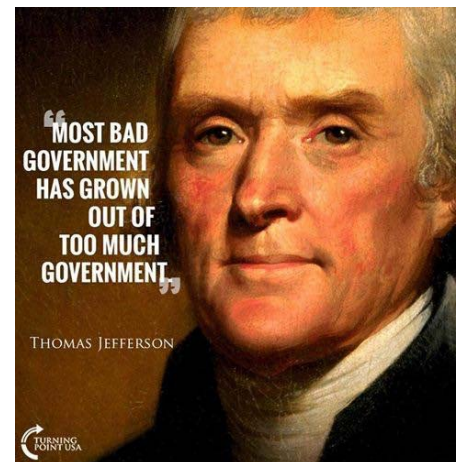
After filling the order, Mocar had 57 more buffalo hides than required. He had a businessman brother in New York, to whom he shipped those remaining 57 bison hides. Wright instructed this brother to see what he could come up with along the way of finding a use for the hides. A tannery in New York figured out a successful method to adequately tan the tough thick buffalo hides. In fact, in 1872, the tannery immediately ordered 2000 more hides from Mocar’s brother. The hides became the tough leather used for conveyor belts on the massive machines in the industrial manufacturing businesses that were beginning to boom in the USA and abroad.

The 3 Mocar brothers formed a partnership to help supply the demand. Almost overnight, the demand became so great, that they were shipping millions of hides. Hunters came by the 100s to the Dodge City area of Kansas, and the slaughter began en masse. Lobenstein, Rath, and Myer remained the main businessmen involved in the buying of the hides. The hides went to tanners all over the eastern United States and to markets across Europe. From the end of 1871 through the beginning of 1873, the central buffalo herd around Kansas and Nebraska was essentially wiped out; only small, isolated herds remained. The hunt was not the only reason for the central herd’s demise, though. In 1872, a vast herd of millions of buffalo started crossing the Arkansas River. This herd was six or seven weeks crossing the Arkansas. They migrated north, ultimately to the Hudson Bay Area. They were trapped

there by an enormous winter with horrible temperatures, so they perished. The major reason for the death of the central herd was due to this unusual migration, not the reckless killing by the hunters

By 1874, the hunters were searching out other herds to supply their needs. In late 1873, J. Wright Mocar went into the Texas Panhandle. There, he found herds that still numbered into the millions. The big bison hunt was about to begin. The story will continue next month.
